"Eco-Printing" by Dawn Edwards, a renown felt artist:

Eco-printing is gaining in popularity all around the world...Come and find out why. If you're unfamiliar with eco-printing, also known as botanical printing, it quite simply refers to leaves and plant matter that print through a bundling and heating process. Eco-printing differs from 'natural dyeing'...while both use natural plant materials, natural dyeing more commonly results in a fabric being dyed in one particular color. With eco-printing, you actually see the wonderful leaf prints on your piece, some, such as Eucalyptus leaves actually print in bright colors.

Dawn Edwards is a felt artist and tutor based in Plainwell, Michigan. She sells her work under the label 'Felt So Right' and teaches extensively within the USA and internationally, including Australia, Ireland, Chile and this year at London Hat Week. Her felt art has appeared in numerous exhibitions, shows, magazines and books, including Ellen Bakker's book, "Worldwide Colours of Felt", several issues of the Australian 'FELT' Magazine, the International Feltmakers Association Felt Matters journal, the HGA journal Shuttle, Spindle & Dyepot, the Russian magazine 'Felt Fashion', and recently her 'Blue Coral' felt hat was chosen to appear in the Fiber Art Now: Felt: Fiber Transformed.

Laura Viada is an artist who

works in the medium of fiber, primarily as a handweaver. Using linen, silk, cotton, and metallic threads as her "paints", Laura creates visually complex works using the simple elements of geometric form and the interaction of color. She employs many different weaving techniques, but her "go to" favorites are diversified plain weave and transparency. She has taught both topics widely over the last 15 years, including numerous regional and three Convergence® conferences. Her most recent works explore color using Theo Moorman technique

Robbie LaFleur has been following a thread of Scandinavian textiles since she studied weaving at Valdres Husflidsskole in Fagernes, Norway in 1977. She has continued her study with Scandinavian instructors at workshops in Norway and the U.S. Recent projects include interpreting Edvard Munch's "Scream" painting into a variety of textile techniques (British Journal for Weavers, Spinners and Dyers' article) and weaving tapestry portraits of her relatives. She was awarded the Gold Medal in Weaving from the Vesterheim Norwegian-American Museum in 2006. Robbie coordinates the Weavers Guild of Minnesota's Scandinavian Weavers Study Group and is the editor and publisher of the quarterly Norwegian Textile Letter.

Lucienne Coifman has taught weaving for almost 45 years at the Guilford Art Center (Guilford, CT), The Creative Art workshop (New Haven, CT) and in her own studio. She's also conducted workshops throughout the Northeast and the Midwest, including the last 4 Convergence® conferences. For 35 years, Lucienne has been studying Rep

Weave, experimenting with different fibers. Her main interest has centered on color interactions and patterns, using up to 8 harnesses and using pick-up techniques when needed. She has researched many unusual ways to weave Rep Weave that do not follow the traditional path. Her weavings have appeared in *Shuttle Spindle & Dyepot*, *Handwoven*, and have been included in many juried exhibits. Her book, *REP - RIPS - REPS*



February 9, 2021

Nathalie Miebach explores the intersection of art and science by translating scientific data related to meteorology, ecology and oceanography into woven sculptures and musical scores/performances. Her main method of data translation is that of basket weaving, which functions as a simple, tactile grid through which to interpret data into 3D space. Central to this work is her desire to explore the role visual and musical aesthetics play in the translation and understanding of complex scientific systems, such as weather.

Susan introduced our quest speaker, Martha Town.

Martha's presentation: "Twill Explorations." Martha has been weaving for 40 years, learning from books, workshops and conferences. She has earned The Handweavers Guild of America Certificate of Excellence Level 1 in 1986. That intense study helped her define her love of Twill geometric patterns that weave up quickly. A thorough understanding of twill made a move to computer design and multi harness weaving inevitable. She weaves on two 8 shaft looms, and an AVL 16 shaft compu-dobby loom. Martha lives in Hillsdale County, on a 100-acre farm with her husband, a flock of sheep, and grass fed cows. She retired from a career in Medical Technology, having worked in a hospital lab for 44 years. Martha participated in several guilds in southern Michigan, and she's happy to be making use of her work in weaving shows and have been awarded several Complex Weavers Awards, Handweavers Guild awards AND MLH awards.

Martha started her presentation with a member survey: Asking:

Members who own a 4-shaft loom...76% yes 24% no.

Members who own an 8-shaft loom...71% yes 29% no

Members who own a multi-shaft loom..41% yes 59% no

Members who have previously woven Twill 94% yes 6% no

Martha's presentation was very well received, extremely informative and skillfully presented. Thank You.

One of our WGK members wants to sell her Wolf Pup loom. It is a 4 Shaft, 6 treadle with 18" weaving width. Perfect for workshops or smaller studio spaces. Includes Bench 2 reeds(10, 12) and various supplies. She wants the proceeds to go to the guild. If you are interested in this loom, it is offered for \$1000, the loom alone would be over \$1400. She finds the loom will not work for her needs and wishes someone else may find it to their liking. The loom has never been used.

From the Schact web site:

Here is a 4-shaft loom you can easily take anywhere with you. The 18" weaving width is ideal for workshops and for all those other narrow projects.

We've used the same sturdy X-frame and barrel-nut construction for our Wolf Pup looms as we use for our other Wolf looms. We also use many of the same components: steel hub friction brake, brake release foot pedal, aluminum harness channels, and an attached beater pin. The loom comes with stainless steel heddle bars and a stainless steel reed (choice of 6, 8, 10, 12 or 15 dent), and 300 inserted eye heddles.

Ann Niemi is in possession of the loom and the loom can be picked up at her home. Contact Ann at 269-217-3931.
