In a few instances, the same name describes different things. Natalie will lay it all out in a clear and practical manner so you can confidently explore the lace maze.

Natalie Boyett founded The Chicago Weaving School in 2004. Weavers of all levels of experience have found a weekly home to learn, share and create. Deep-weaving: Drafting Immersion is a 12 week online drafting and weave structure theory course Natalie created for weavers who want to dive in to the joys of interpreting, augmenting and designing weave drafts.

2020 Holiday Sale Information

This year the holiday sale will be conducted both in person and online. You can choose to participate in either online or in-person, or both. For the online sale you will send in images of three (3) pieces to be displayed on the KIA website. If sold, you will be contacted and have (3) days to bring the work to the KIA to be picked up by the buyer. The inperson sale will look a lot different this year. It will be scaled and less work will be displayed. Some departments will set limits for the number of pieces you can bring in. **You will not** be able to stay by your work during the sale. If you wish to attend the sale you must get a timed-ticket available on the KIA website. Artwork will be dropped off and set up by curators, not the artist, for the sale. Limited capacity, social distancing, and all safety procedures will be enforced.

Return the 'holiday sale signup' sheet filled out to <u>holidaysale@kiarts.org</u> and sign up for at least one job by October 16th to participate.

Drop your artwork off at the KIA on Tuesday the 17th. More information will be sent out about drop off.

Be sure to list your mailing address on our signup, since all checks will be mailed this year.

In-person sale:

Customers will get a timed ticket to monitor capacity levels. Once they arrive their ticket will be scanned for entry. They will be reminded of social distancing and directed towards the school. A volunteer will be stationed outside each studio, counting how many people are inside. They will remind everyone to use hand sanitizer when entering each room. Volunteers will give shoppers a heads up when their time is almost over.

Artists will choose their best work, keeping in mind the sale will be scaled down.

Artists will pick up their labels (labels will only be made if you return your signup sheet).

You will drop off your artwork on Tuesday November 17th. (More information to come).

All work will be quarantined overnight before being set up by curators.

You will not be setting up your own work and you will not be standing by your work.

** If you test positive for COVID or have come into contact with a COVID positive person you may not attend the sale in person. If so, you will need to have someone cover your shift. **

Online sale:

Choose three (3) of your pieces to be put online.

Photograph your 3-D work with either <u>a white or black background only</u> or fill the image frame if the work is 2-D

Image size must be 650 x650 pixels or less and your file size must be 8MB or less.

Inventory your three pieces by labeling them with your last name and the numbers 1-3

Send your three images labeled with your name, inventory number, size, medium, and price.

Keep your piece at home, once your piece is sold you will be contacted. You will have three (3) days to bring your piece to the KIA to complete the transaction. If you do not bring your work to the KIA in (3) days, your sale will be void.

If you have multiples of one piece, such as a set of mugs, please include quantity in your inventory. These pieces have to be reasonably similar in size, color, and form.

Please note, work sold online can be shipped but it is the artist's responsibility to ship. You are not required to provide shipping. Please let us know at the sign up if you aren't willing to ship.

Other:

Some new things being implemented in this sale are personal shoppers. Before the sale begins each morning, we are offering personal shoppers to shop via zoom and have a guided tour of the sale as a personal shopper picks out work for them to purchase.

65% of your barcode price will be paid to you, 35% will go towards your department and the sale overhead. Checks will be mailed.

If you are participating in multiple departments, you will need to fill out a signup sheet for each department and send them all in. You will also need to sign up for two jobs.

FAQ

Who is eligible to sell at the Holiday Art sale?

KIA faculty, as well as any student who has taken a class or workshop at the KIA within the 2020 school year.

What can be sold at the Holiday Art Sale?

Your work must represent a medium taught at the KIA

No damaged items (i.e. no cracked pottery, broken or badly scratched frames, etc.)

2-D work should be matted and/or inexpensively framed. If work is not framed, it must be mounted on stiff board and covered with acetate.

If work is a digital copy of a painting, drawing, or pastel, it must be stated on the back of the work.

How do I put prices on my work?

All work must have a barcode label. Work cannot be sold without a barcode label.

Use only even dollar amounts on labels.

No special prices for multiple-item purchases.

No price reductions on any items during the sale.

Business cards will be allowed only if they are attached to each piece of your work.

How will I be paid for any artwork sold?

Payments will be received by mail after the sale is finished.

Can I stay with my work?

No. For each person who stays with their work there is one less customer in the building because of capacity limits. You will not be setting up your own work and you will not be standing by it during the sale. There will be people stationed in the rooms to monitor work.

Do I have to volunteer for a job?

Yes. If you are participating in the in-person sale you must sign up and participate in at least one job. We ask if you can, please sign up for more than one. If you sign up for a job and do not show up, you will not be able to participate in the sale again. If you cannot come because you've been diagnosed with or have come into contact with COVID you must notify us at <a href="https://hotspace.org/hotspa

Throw in the Towel Project Goal

Goal: Each Participant will bring a handwoven towel to the grand towel exchange (set for September 14th, COVID-19 permitting) and go home with a different handwoven towel. Meanwhile, all meeting attendees get to see and admire the entire collection. Plus, ultimately an online book of all the towels and their instructions will be assembled for WGK members on our website

Weavers of all levels are welcome to participate! Every participant must complete a Project Form Keep good records!

Towels can be woven on Table Looms, Floor Looms, Rigid Heddle Looms on any number of shafts.

What to Weave? "Towel" is actually a very broad term, so let's agree on some guidelines, but we won't have towel police measuring your entries. If we aim for what are referred to in most weaving publications as Kitchen Towels, Tea Towels, Hand Towels we should come out in the right ballpark.

Finished size (When planning, be sure to allow for draw-in on the loom and shrinkage in the finishing process) These are the measurements used by MAFA in their exchange and certainly give a lot of leeway.

Width-between 14 and 20 inches (This should accommodate those with smaller looms.)

Length-between 20 and 30 inches after hemmin

Colors - Weaver's choice.

Weave structure – Weaver's choice (does <u>not</u> need to be an original design but please keep a record of your inspiration or pattern for proper attribution).

Fiber content – Cotton, cottolin, linen work best for towels to be used and washed often.

Fiber thickness is Weaver's choice. Regarding Sett: Try to take into consideration the intended use of towels—loose setts, long floats might be a problem

Finishing—Towels should be wet-finished and ironed for the exchange. It would be ideal if everyone could record the before and after measurements as a guide for shrinkage.

Hems – Weaver's choice (fringed, hemstitched, turned hem, but bear in mind that towels are intended to take a bit of beating. Hems can be hand or machine sewn).

Photographs- Each weaver should take a photo of his or her towel and send it along with the information requested on the Project Sheet.

Please send your Project Sheet in by September 1, 2020 and bring your towel with you to the September 14, 2020 WGK Meeting for the Exchange Be sure to label your towel with your full name (you can just attach with a safety pin.


